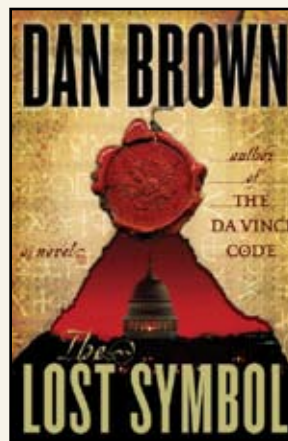

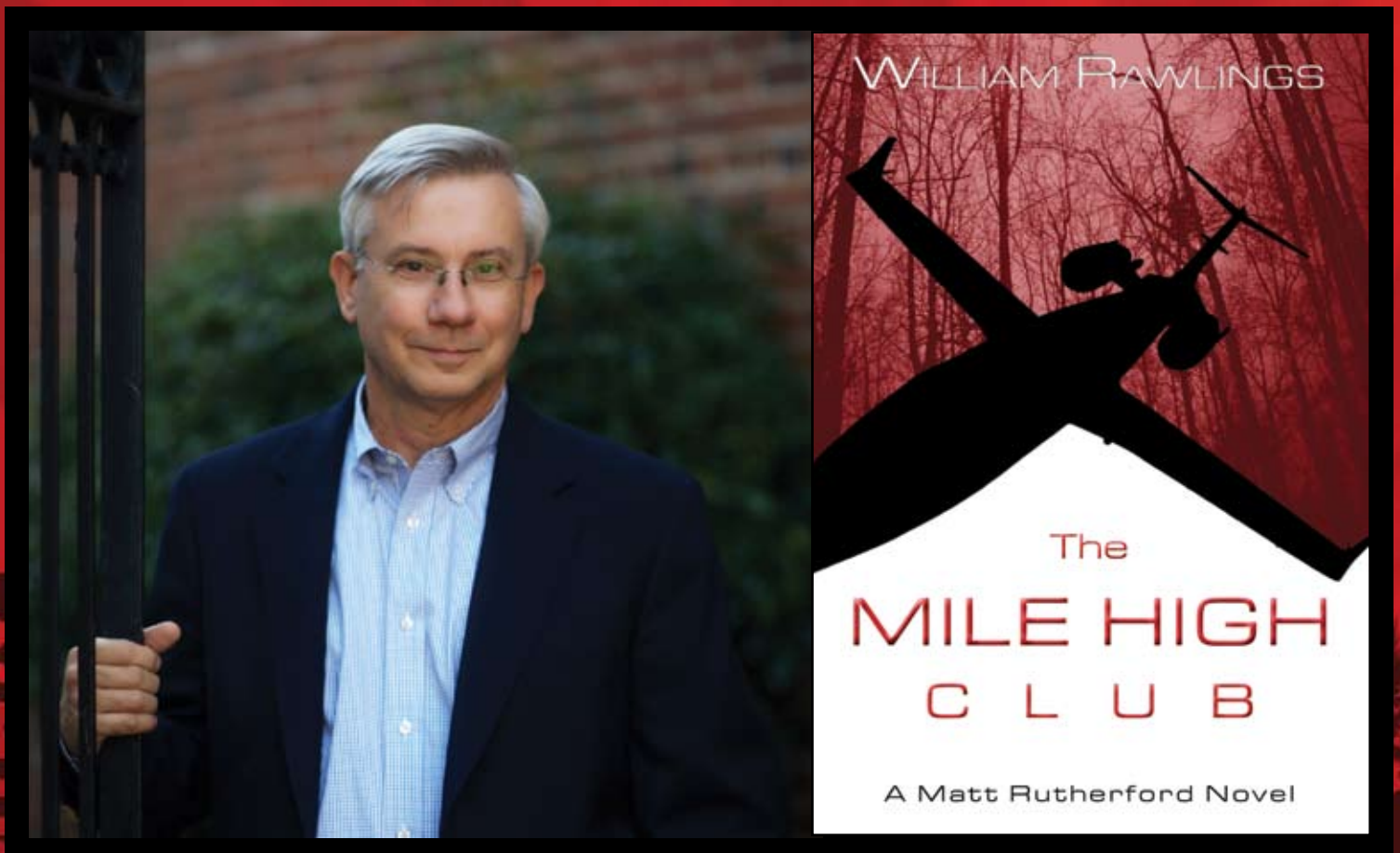

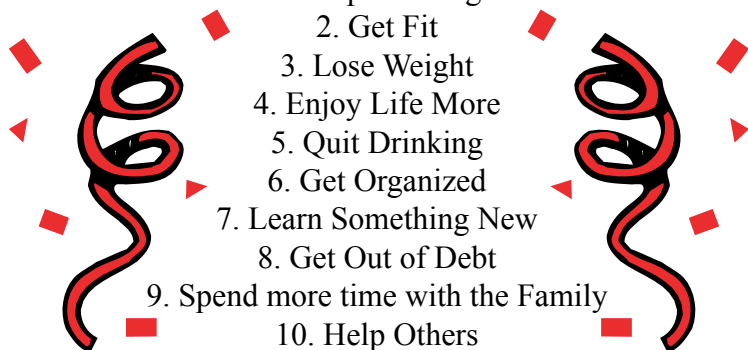

# From the Learning Center

## Making the Adjustment

I don't know of any time during a round of golf here at Idle Hour, other than on the tee, that I ever have a level lie to play off of. There always seems to be some sort of slope involved. What makes it hard is that we are always practicing from level lies and often aren't sure of the adjustments that need to be made with our swing when we encounter a sloping lie. Here are some typical adjustments you can make when playing from sloping lies.

When faced with an uphill shot the ball will tend to go higher. When choosing a club, take one with less loft than you would normally use. Play the ball off of your front foot and align your body perpendicular to the slope. Match your swing to the slope and swing normally. You will want to limit your backswing on a steeper slope.

When faced with a downhill shot, the ball will tend to go lower. Use more loft on the club, especially on those lies that are steeply downhill. Play the ball in the center of your stance for gentle slopes, and off of your back foot for the steeper ones. Again, limit your backswing and be sure to follow the slope past impact.

When you are paying a shot with the ball above your feet, the ball will tend to go left. It's important to note that a higher lofted club will drift more left than usual. Aim more to the right, choke down on the club and stand further for the ball during setup. Swing normally on a gentle slope but take a flatter, more around path for a severe slope. Restrict your backswing for stability.

When the ball is below your feet, the ball will tend to fly to the right. There is no need for club selection adjustments on a gentle slope, but use less loft on a more severe slope to compensate for a more restricted swing. Aim more left of the target, stand closer to the ball and bend your knees. Swing normally on the gentle slopes with a limited backswing for balance. You will also want to take a steeper backswing if the slope is more severe.

The better you can adjust and adapt your swing to the situation and terrain, the lower your scores will become.

### January 2010 \* IHCC Recipe of the Month

## Duck & Apple Spring Roll

#### Ingredients

4 Granny Smith Apples  
1/2 tsp. Ground Cinnamon  
1/4 tsp. Ground Cloves  
1/4 tsp. Ground Nutmeg  
3 Tbs. Granulated Sugar  
2 lbs. Duck Breast  
1 lb. Pancetta  
8 oz. Goat Cheese  
24 Egg Roll Wrappers  
1 Whole Egg  
1 Tbs. Water

Season and sear duck breast, set aside rendered fat, and finish in oven. Rest duck, remove skin and julienne. Peel and julienne apples. Saute apples in duck fat with sugar, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg and 1/4 tsp. of salt and pepper for one minute (or until slightly tender) and cool in a separate pan. Fine dice pancetta, brown and drain fat. Prepare egg wash with eggs and water. To roll, use 1/2 oz. duck, 3 tbs. apples, 1/3 oz. goat cheese and 2 tsp. pancetta (add salt and pepper). Brush edges of egg roll wrappers to seal. Once rolled, dust with cornstarch to store.
